REPAIR

Repair or replace damaged items, such as cracked steps, missing shingles, broken fences, or window screens, so the property looks well-maintained and cared for. Ensure that the roof is in good condition and replace any damaged shingles or tiles. CLEAN

Ensure that the exterior of the property is clean, including the roof, windows, siding, and driveway. The lack of a clean, inviting entrance to the home can <u>cost as much as 7%</u> of the home's value. <u>Power washing</u> the exterior is always a good idea if there is any noticeable mold when standing outside the house. If there is a concrete driveway, check to see if a quick power wash will help that appearance as well. Don't forget about the windows, gutters, and <u>these additional ideas on cleaning your home exterior</u>.





LANDSCAPE

Remove any debris, leaves, and dead plants. Make sure that the lawn looks freshly mowed and that the driveway and walkways are free of weeds, clutter, and unnecessary objects. Trim the lawn around its borders and prune any hedges and trees as needed. If there are garden beds, add fresh mulch to them also. Good landscaping can <u>add as much as 11% to</u> <u>the value</u> of the home and <u>doesn't have to cost</u>

ADD SOME COLOR
